Using Gift Aid means that for every pound you give, the Guild of Benevolence will receive at least an extra 25 pence from HMRC, helping your donation go further.

This means that £10 can be turned into at least £12.50 just so long as donations are made through Gift Aid.

Imagine what a difference that could make - and it doesn't cost you a thing. In fact if you are a higher rate taxpayer, you can offset some of your donation against your own personal taxable income.
