



Reducing our environmental footprint

As part of the IMarEST's continued plan to achieve its zero-carbon goal for the Marine Professional, the magazine is now distributed to members subscribing to the printed version in a new paper wrapping. The wrap is printed on paper from sustainably managed and controlled sources which is 100% recyclable.

The printed paper is endorsed by the Programme for the Endorsement of Forest Certification (PEFC) – a non-profit, non-governmental organisation that promotes sustainable forest management through independent third party certification. It is considered the certification system of choice for small forest owners. All PEFC-endorsed standards have been subjected to rigorous public review during their development.

This is a strong step in reducing the Marine Professional's environmental footprint and is the latest in a series of efforts we've taken to increase the eco-friendliness of the magazine, including an expanded digital content portfolio and a reduction in print publication frequency to four larger 'bumper' issues per year.

The IMarEST vision going forward remains to gradually transition the magazine towards full digitalisation in the future, with a view to becoming near-carbon neutral. However, whilst the demand from members to receive a hard copy of the magazine prevails, we will take whatever measures are feasible to mitigate the impact as best we can.
