



IMarEST Book Prize

A book prize is awarded to the highest achieving student (UG or PG) or cadet on any course or apprenticeship formally accredited by the IMarEST. The student should be in the final year of their course.

Prize

An appropriate book selected from the IMarEST catalogue and a certificate

Deadline for nominations Nominations for the book prizes must be made directly by representatives from the awarding institution and received by end of July each year. If a university/training college/apprenticeship are unable to nominate a student(s) by this date they are required to inform the IMarEST, in writing, by the end of July giving the approximate date by which they will be able to make a nomination. Applications should be made to awards@imarest.org

Criteria

The prize is awarded to the highest achieving student in their final year of any course (UG or PG), cadet training course or apprenticeship formally accredited by the IMarEST. Nominations should be based on the final mark received or an alternative formal method of assessment. Applications for the award must be made by a representative of the institution, not an individual applicant and should include

- College/University
- Full Name of Nominee with surname/family name highlighted
- Gender of applicant
- Full Title of Course/Apprenticeship
- Full Address to which Prize should be sent
- Details of when the Prize is to be presented

Assessment

The Institute will assume that the application for the award, made by the Institution on behalf of the individual will be made in good faith and that the institution's assessment procedures are sound.

Rules of the Award

- The IMarEST will consider all properly submitted nominations and any materials supplied in support of them.
- Nominations will be accepted on the condition that:



- The IMarEST may disclose the names of the nominee(s) and the nominator(s);
- A maximum of one named individual per accredited course may be included in the nomination
- The IMarEST will select the book to be awarded to the winners but will consider specific requests from institutions on a case by case basis.
